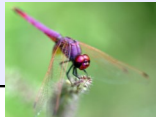


– Learn how to create a beautiful yard for your enjoyment and the enjoyment of the wildlife. We also explain how to become an

Invasion Nation

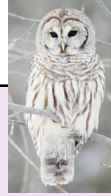

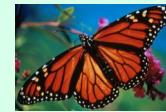
Neotropical Birds – Winter Vacationers

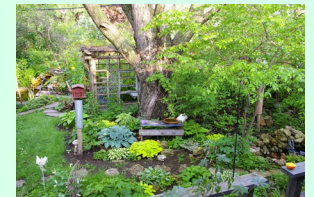


Hummingbirds & Butterflies
